BAWDSEY SCHOOL has begun Marvellous May- Martha in year 6 has won a design a banner competition for the Suffolk School Games. Her banner showed all the sports and values for the organisation and will now be made into large banners to advertise all the competitions for Suffolk. Our year 3 and 4 class have gone through two rounds of the Suffolk farming school of the year competition run by the Suffolk show and we are now one of the finalists against two other schools for the whole competition.

We have started gardening club in earnest at school. If anyone has any seeds or seedlings they could donate we would appreciate it to use at school or in our new beds that we are just starting to garden at the Suffolk Punch Trust's Heritage garden. All the children at school, from Reception to year 6 will get the chance to go and garden at the Trust and they are really looking forward to it.

Years 3-6 are looking forward to their trip to the Harry Potter studio tour in two weeks- our thanks go to the Bawdsey School Association which has heavily subsidised the trip for the children.

Our Baby and Toddler group is going from strength to strength with swelling numbers and is available for any parent or carer (including grandparents) who would like to join us with any age of baby or Pre-school child. It is on a Friday afternoon from 1.30-3.15, no booking is needed and there are no costs involved. The children play in the Nursery setting, while adults get to chat and have a cuppa.

Our Nursery class is also available for any children from their 3rd birthday. There are no cost to parents from their birthday until their government funded sessions start the term after. Then for every government funded session that is brought to the school we will match this session free of charge for the child.

So if the full 15 hours of government funding was brought to the school, we match this with a further 15 hours of free sessions for the child. Which means 30 hours possible child care with no costs for parents or carers. Similarly if a child brings only 2 hours of government funding, we will give 2 hours free from the school. If a session is not funded through government funding or the school's matched funding initiative, sessions are £10 for a morning or afternoon. There are no charges for lunch times and a delicious school dinner cooked on site can be purchased for £2.30.

We also offer a before and after school, child care service from 8am until 6.15pm in the evening. Breakfast club is £2.50 and after school care is £3 for the first hour and £2.50 for each hour thereafter.

And lastly a quick reminder for any Senior residents on the peninsula that they are welcome to join us for lunch on the second Thursday of each month. Please phone to book a place 01394 411365. A cuppa, chat and biscuits are available after too!
