MARY WARNER`S EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION The Charity is empowered to make grants to students who are under the age of 25 and who live (or whose parents live) in the Parishes of Boyton, Butley, Capel St Andrew, Shottisham, Sutton, Bawdsey, Alderton and Hollesley and who may be in need of financial assistance.

The monies must be used for `promoting education` and can include:-

1. Awarding to eligible students scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries, maintenance allowances or grants tenable at any school, university, college of education, or other institution of further (including professional and technical) education approved for the purpose by the Trustees.

2. Providing financial assistance, outfits, clothing, tools, instruments or books to assist such persons to pursue their education (including the study of music and other arts), to undertake travel in furtherance thereof, or to prepare for or enter a profession, trade or service on leaving school, university, or other educational establishment.

The Trustees will be looking to make a fresh set of grants to such students at their next meeting in late September.

CHURCH NEWS Dear Friends

For many people – children especially – August means holidays whether it is school holidays, time away from home or a break from the normal routine. Many clubs and activities take a break in August including our own ‘Messy Church’ and there can be more time for rest and re-creation.

For many people though, rest can seem hard to come by; an impossible luxury perhaps for those in a caring role, in stressful jobs and situations or with many responsibilities. How can we find rest in our ‘24/7’ world?

The Tour de France – or any of the major cycling events which take place over many days - might not be where you would naturally look for an example of rest. But even during the gruelling days of cycling, the competitors who belong to different teams do not need to perform to their maximum capacity every inch of the way. There are opportunities for them to rest on the way – although we might not think of it as rest.

Teammates – known as ‘domestiques’ - take turns to cycle in front of their ‘main’ rider and allow him to coast in their slipstream, saving energy for the key parts of the race.

Rest and re-creation can come in different – and often unexpected – forms. We might not all be able to lie in a deckchair with a good book and a cool drink to hand (we might not all want to!) but we can try and make the most of the opportunities that come our way to take some ‘time out’. BAWDSEY SCHOOL It has been a very busy and exciting academic year at Bawdsey CEVCP School: the pupils have had a wealth of amazing experiences, like a residential trip to France, robotic programming at BT, visiting the Harry Potter studio tour, performing at Snape, country dancing for KS2 and a Hedgehog and Turtle dove day. We have also been successful in our SATs results again this year and for next year we are opening our Nursery to 2 year old children as well. We would like to thank all the parents, carers, families and wider communities for supporting us and helping us in making Bawdsey school the 'Hidden Gem' on the Peninsula.

NURSERY We offer free Nursery placements for children from their 3rd birthday until their government funding starts the following term. Then for every hour of government funding that they bring to Bawdsey School with their child, we will give another hour free. Therefore we could provide 30 hours of free Nursery provision, in return for their 15 hours of government funding. Their child is welcome to join us for free lunchtime sessions too.

We are also opening to 2 year olds in September, so it is worth phoning the school for more information.

We also have before and after school care available from 8am until 6.15pm.
