PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

SUFFOLK COASTAL DISTRICT COUNCIL is undertaking a review of its local plan and has issued Help Plan the Future of the District, Issues and Options for the Suffolk Coastal Local Plan Review, Consultation 18 August – 30 October. Within the document Suffolk Coastal are suggesting that a possible 48 houses in Sutton located within the boundary of the chequer field, as well as housing (10) between the existing settlements along the Main Road (Woodbridge Road) on the south side.

Public consultation is an important part of the Local Plan process and throughout the consultation period a series of drop in sessions have been arranged. These sessions are open to anybody who wishes to find out more about the consultation and one of these sessions is being held at Suffolk Coastal District Council (Deben Room), East Suffolk House, Station Road, Melton on Tuesday 26 September 1600-19.30 hours. There are other venues available at other times, details on the web page. Alternatively paper copies of the document can be viewed at any library in the district or mobile library.

Should you wish to make comments on the consultation document, they must be submitted and received no later than 23.45 on Monday 30 October.

MARY WARNER`S EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION The Charity is empowered to make grants to students who are under the age of 25 and who live (or whose parents live) in the Parishes of Boyton, Butley, Capel St Andrew, Shottisham, Sutton, Bawdsey, Alderton and Hollesley and who may be in need of financial assistance.

The monies must be used for `promoting education` and can include:-

1. Awarding to eligible students scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries, maintenance allowances or grants tenable at any school, university, college of education, or other institution of further (including professional and technical) education approved for the purpose by the Trustees.

2. Providing financial assistance, outfits, clothing, tools, instruments or books to assist such persons to pursue their education (including the study of music and other arts), to undertake travel in furtherance thereof, or to prepare for or enter a profession, trade or service on leaving school, university, or other educational establishment.

The Trustees will be looking to make a fresh set of grants to such students at their next meeting in late September.

BONFIRES It's getting to be that time of year! Garden bonfires are evocative of autumn and are mostly a pleasant and useful addition to this season of change. Before putting a match to our pile there are a few things to think about. Bonfires are a common cause of disputes, as they often cause smoke, fumes or ash to blow onto or into neighbours' properties causing discomfort and even health problems.

What can and can't I do when I have a bonfire? Firstly, if you are a business of any kind, you must not burn your waste at all - and there are hefty fines for those who do! Domestic householders are allowed to have bonfires but there are some restrictions if you chose to do so.

Can I burn domestic waste? NO! Burning things like plastic, aerosols, clothing, rubber or painted materials is an offence. It is always best to check that no extra bits of rubbish have strayed onto your garden bonfire pile before it is burned. They often produce toxic fumes, smoke and ash that are harmful to you as well as your neighbours or the local wildlife.

How often can I have a garden bonfire? There are no limits as long as your bonfire does not cause any damage to property or undue annoyance to your neighbours. If the council is satisfied that a bonfire is causing a nuisance, then they may take legal action against the person responsible.

How can I avoid my bonfire becoming a nuisance? It is best to follow some simple rules:-

Consider composting the waste. Our sandy soil needs as much compost as you can produce! Use your "brown bin" or take the waste to Foxhall recycling centre - both finish up as compost.

Tell neighbours well in advance - before lighting the bonfire.

Ensure you have the means to control the bonfire before you start.

Be safe, don't use petrol or other fuel oils to start a bonfire - it is dangerous!

Burn small amounts, dry and hot.

Only have a bonfire when you need one and never allow it to burn overnight or unsupervised.

If smoke from your bonfire is being blown onto your neighbours' properties, consider extinguishing it and light it again on another day.

It shouldn't need to be said, but if the pile has been standing, even for only a few days, check it hasn't been adopted as a home by some of our garden wildlife. Turn it over with a garden fork to give any small animals like hedgehogs, time to escape.

If you are having a bonfire, whether it's to get rid of garden waste or part of a celebration, take care. Fire can spread easily, so where and how you build your bonfire is important. As a rule of thumb the minimum distance a bonfire should be from any structure or property is ten times its height. **Have fun, but make sure you, and others, are safe.**

OPEN HOUSE AT BEACH HOUSE, SHINGLE STREET Beach House at Shingle Street will be open for visits, teas and cakes on Saturday 9 September 2017. The house is of significant architectural interest. It was designed and built by John Penn, 1921-2007 as one of nine small modernist houses he built in east Suffolk during the 1960s, an exhibition of which was compiled and shown in her London gallery by Margaret Howell, fashion designer, of Bawdsey. The houses still appear uncompromisingly modern, although now well over 40 years old. Penn was also an accomplished painter and furniture designer. Brought up at Bawdsey Hall, he served in the Grenadier Guards and won the Military Cross. He then qualified in architecture, partly studying in California with Neutra. Beach House will be open from 11.00am-5.00pm, with a £5 entrance fee. For a further £5, the exhibition compiled by Margaret Howell, will be available to view with the chance to talk to Margaret, and to hear from Tony Chambers, the editor of 'Wallpaper', the design magazine, who owns a Penn house in Rendham.
