PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

SUFFOLK COASTAL DISTRICT COUNCIL is undertaking a review of its local plan and has issued Help Plan the Future of the District, Issues and Options for the Suffolk Coastal Local Plan Review, Consultation 18 August – 30 October. Within the document Suffolk Coastal are suggesting that a possible 48 houses in Sutton located within the boundary of the chequer field, behind the properties in Woodbridge Road and also behind properties in Old Post Office Lane as well as housing (10) between the existing settlements along the Main Road (Woodbridge Road) on the south side.

There is a paper copy of the document available for viewing at any library in the district or on the mobile library van. **If you wish to make any comment on the consultation document or any part of the supporting documents/ plans then it is important that you contact by either email to suffolkcoastallocalplan@eastsuffolk.gov.uk or letter addressed to Planning Policy & Delivery Team, East Suffolk House, Station Road, Melton, Woodbridge, IP12 1RT to be received no later than 23.45 on Monday 30 October.**

Public consultation is an important part of the Local Plan process and throughout the consultation period a series of drop in sessions have been arranged. These sessions are open to anybody who wishes to find out more about the consultation and are being held in the following venues during October:

Kirton Recreation Ground (The pavilion) Back Road Kirton IP10 OPW on Monday 2 October 1600-19.30

and Riverside Centre, 6 Gt Glemham Road, Stratford St Andrew IP17 1LL on Wednesday 11 October 1600-19.30

IMPENDING CLOSURE OF WOODS LANE MELTON the first closure will be to construct new footpaths, bus stops and prepare for the more substantial works after Christmas, the first phase closure will be for the period 6 November -30 November. The second phase, 8 Jan-13 April, will be to install the sewer pipes and connections. The road will be completely closed and a traffic light managed one way system cannot be implemented. The planned diversion route will be through Woodbridge.

EAST ANGLIA ONE The work on the construction of the temporary haul road in Ramsholt due to start the week of 25 September. In order to build the road, lorries delivering stone will first need to pass through our village to access Ramsholt.

NEW ROOF FOR SUTTON MEMORIAL HALL Residents of Sutton are celebrating the completion of a Project to replace the ageing asbestos roof on the Village Memorial Hall. The Hall was built in 1948 by local residents on land donated to the Parish by the local landowners, the Paul family. The building was constructed with the usual materials available at that time, namely reinforced concrete frame with block walls and an asbestos roof. Succeeding generations of residents have upgraded the hall over the years by adding a side hall and kitchen, insulation, double glazing and heating. Most recently, the kitchen was refurbished. However, during recent heavy rain falls, it was apparent that the roof was beginning to leak and needed replacing. The Memorial Hall committee immediately commenced raising funds to enable this to take place. By the spring of this year, with the help of an Exemplar Programme Grant from Suffolk Coastal District Council, an allocation from the Locality Budget of District Councillor, Mrs Christine Block, and a grant from the Awards for All Big Lottery Fund, sufficient funds were available for the work to take place. The contract was awarded to J C Services (Anglia) Ltd., who worked with the committee to find a vacant slot in the hall bookings for the work to be carried out. They, in turn, had to choose two dry days within that period to remove the old roof and replace it with new composite sheets. This was successfully done over the weekend of 1st – 2nd July 2017.

The completion of this Project ensures that the facilities available to the local community within the hall for weddings, parties, friendship lunches, quiz nights and other activities are protected for the foreseeable future. The Sutton Memorial Hall Committee are very grateful to everyone who has made this Project possible.

CHURCH NEWS Dear Friends

Now that October is here, the days are getting short and the nights are drawing in. Darkness seems to be closing in – and not just literally but in events we hear of around the world and perhaps in our own life too. Autumn is traditionally a time of melancholy as we reflect on the fading of summer light and warmth. Some people try to neutralise the scariness of dark thoughts and fears – things of the night’ by confronting them at Halloween. Much of Christianity emphasises the coming of the light of Jesus Christ into a world of darkness. We celebrate that Light particularly at Christmas and Easter but also at the feast of All Saints (1st November, the day after the ‘eve of All Hallows’ or Halloween).

Yet darkness – physical or spiritual – is a fact of life and God is with us in our darkness just as much as in the light. Although it is harder for us humans to see in the dark, it can be a time of growth and re-creation as well as a time of rest. I can remember a summer visit to Iceland when the almost continuous daylight made it difficult to sleep, to ‘switch off’. A time of darkness, pain, grief or anxiety can be very difficult and is not something we actively seek or welcome. But through darkness and doubt often come the greatest creativity and faith.

CONFIRMATION – WHAT IS IT? WHAT’S INVOLVED?

‘Confirmation’ comes from a Latin word meaning to strengthen. In the Church of England, a service of Confirmation, led by a Bishop, is the opportunity for people to make a public commitment to the Christian faith, *confirming* for themselves the promises that were made on their behalf if they were baptised/christened as infants. (Those who are not already baptised can be baptised at the same service.) The Bishop prays for God’s Holy Spirit to *strengthen* each person to continue to grow in their relationship with God.

There is going to be a service of Confirmation locally on Wed November 8th and there is an opportunity for both youngsters (at least 10 years old) and adults to explore Christian faith and whether they would like to be confirmed, starting this month.
