Dear Friends

Some of you may have watched the recent TV series following several 'celebrities' as they tackled the pilgrimage route to Santiago de Compostela in Spain. In recent years this route has seen greatly increased numbers of pilgrims and has inspired the Hollywood movie, *The Way*. Pilgrimage can be a way to re-centre ourselves on that which is truly important in our lives.

As you read this I hope I will be undertaking a pilgrimage of my own – walking the St Cuthbert's Way from Melrose in Scotland to Holy Island (Lindisfarne) and then down the Northumberland coast along part of the St Oswald's Way – a total of 130 miles.

However, it is not necessary to travel to distant lands – or even many miles - to be a pilgrim. We can, in fact, do so on our own doorstep and turn any journey into a pilgrimage if we adopt the attitude of it being for a deeper purpose. In this part of Suffolk we are blessed both with an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and with many historic church buildings which have witnessed prayer and worship for many hundreds of years.

Over these next three months, while I am away, I hope to share through these pages something of what it might mean to be a 'pilgrim', breaking pilgrimage down into three essential parts – the journey, the destination and the going home.

ARMISTICE 100 EXHIBITION a project to remember the men of Alderton, Bawdsey, Boyton, Capel St Andrew, Hollesley, Ramsholt, Shottisham and Sutton who returned from the Great War. **Open daily 13 October to 30 November at Alderton Church.** Opening Ceremony Saturday 13 October 2.30pm. Song of Praise Sunday 25 November 3pm. The exhibition will include information sheets on all the men who served in any branch of the armed forces between August 1914 and November 1918, with time allowances into 1919. The basis of the research is the 1911 Census, using Ancestry and Find my Past. Therefore there are names of men for whom no military records can be found, these names will be listed in the hope that information comes to light from visitors.
